Sr. Carol Bosbonis, 88, died Thursday, May 19, 2016 at Central DuPage Hospital, Wheaton, Illinois. She entered the Franciscan order in 1963 and professed perpetual vows in 1970. Sr. Carol began her ministry in 1967 as a group mother for the Sacred Heart Home, an orphanage in Pueblo, Colorado serving until 1970. In 1971, upon completing her Bachelor's, she moved to Wheaton to serve as a social worker for Marianjoy Rehabilitation Hospital. Ministry as a social worker led her to serve from 1975-1980 for the Washtenaw Association for Retarded Citizens in Ann Arbor, MI, as well as in later years 1989-1990, for Catholic Charities in Joliet and Lombard, IL. In addition, Sr. Carol served as local directress in Wheaton from 1972-1973 and again 1982-1988.

In May, 1992, Sr. Carol began a ministry in Nigeria, which lasted until 2002. During her ministry in Nigeria, she made several trips back to the United States until her final return in 2002. Also in 2002, Sr. Carol was awarded the Peacemaker Award by the Franciscan Federation. She then returned to the Motherhouse in Wheaton where she volunteered her services as her health permitted. Sr. Carol dedicated herself to the service of others. We pray that now she will receive the reward for her total giving as she rests in the arms of the Lord.

May she enjoy God's loving presence for all eternity.
